100% of students will graduate, ready for college and career.

100% of 8-year-olds will read on grade level.

J. Hampton Moore's GOALS:

At least 35% of students in grades 3-5 will score at or above grade-level on the district's within-year reading assessment in Q2.

43% of students in grades 3-5 scored At/Above Benchmark in the Spring STAR ELA benchmark (5/2024)

At least 35% of students in grades K-3 will score at or above grade-level on the district's within-year reading assessment in Q2.

40.1% of students in grades K-3 scored At/Above Benchmark in the Spring STAR ELA benchmark (5/2024)

At least 25% of students in grades 3-5 will score at or above grade-level on the district's within-year math assessment in Q2.

29.5% of students in grades 3-5 scored At/Above Benchmark in the Spring STAR Math benchmark (5/2024)

At least 57% of students will attend school 95% of days or more in Q2.

72.3% of students attended school 90% of days or more in the month of May 2024.

At least 100% of students will have zero out-of-school suspensions in Q2.

99.8% of students have zero out-of-school suspensions through May 2024.

SCHOOL/TEACHER RESPONSIBILITIES:

J. Hampton Moore will:

On a daily basis, teachers will provide students with online access to intervention programs. Teachers will also provide parents with the necessary log-in information to access intervention programs at home. On a monthly basis, teachers will provide families with games and activities that families can play to review the grade-level skills being covered in class. On a quarterly basis, the school will provide parent workshops in both areas of reading and math.

PARENT RESPONSIBILITIES:

We, as parents, will:

Families will encourage their children to access intervention programs at home as additional support. Families will work on the activities, read with and play the games provided by teachers monthly, with their children. Families will also participate in at least one (1) parent workshop scheduled during the school year. Families will ensure that students arrive on time each day prepared to learn.

STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES:

Students will access web based interventions at home through the use of their chromebook or at the public library. Students will bring home the materials and will play the games at home with their families to gain practice in grade level skills being covered in class. Students will complete all homework assignments in a timely fashion and will ask for help when needed.
